**AUGUST 17th, 2021 Fights For the Flag at Gettysburg:** It was a great honor to carry the flag for your regiment. Join Licensed Battlefield Guide, **Deb Novatny**, as she shares many interesting stories involving the brave soldiers, both North and South, as they captured or defended the Flag during the Battle of Gettysburg.

**SEPTEMBER 21st, 2021 Veterans of the U.S. Colored Troops from Gettysburg and Adams County:** Compiled by the Adams County Historical Society, presenter **Deb McCauslin** will share letters, stories and statistics about these amazing men and what their Adams County families had to endure. These are untold stories about African American troops who marched through Richmond and who witnessed Appomattox.

**OCTOBER 19th, 2021 Introducing Rosie the Riveter, Don't Mess with Harry the Neck! & Other Gettysburg Town Unknowns:** Licensed Town Guide, Fairleigh Dickinson University instructor and reenactor, **Elaine Leslie**, has compiled intriguing short stories about locals from the Revolutionary, Civil War and into the WWII time line. Nixon, Kennedy, Pardee Field, A Civil War Love Story, are some of the many topics Leslie's research has uncovered.

**MARCH 15, 2022 Presidents Visiting Gettysburg:** When it comes to Presidents and Gettysburg, Lincoln and Eisenhower come to mind, but at least 26 Presidents have visited, spoken, or written to commemorate the Gettysburg battle or Lincoln's address. Licensed Battlefield Guide, **Dr. Richard Goedkoop**, will recount these connections with photos and a power point presentation.

**APRIL 19, 2022 "It is All My Fault": Robert E. Lee's Gettysburg Legacy** Join **Codie Eash**, Visitors Services Coordinator at the Seminary Ridge Museum for an analysis of the monuments, speeches, soldiers' recollections, art, film and public interpretation that have influenced our thinking on the stories surrounding Lee's legacy.

**MAY 17, 2022 Researching Gettysburg's Pearl Harbor Connection: The Story Behind the Story:** On Dec. 7, 1941 a fascinating story appeared in the Gettysburg Times about 3 Pennsylvania sailors and 1 Marine who had been killed in the attack. After two years of research, former History teacher and FDNY Chief, **Ken Zaveckas**, will present numerous ironies of this story.

**JUNE 21, 2022 Explaining Away Myths of Civil War Medicine:** Join living historian, **Rusty Dicks**, "Civil War Surgeon" as he presents his vast collection of historical artifacts, and reproduction items to introduce the audience to an understanding of some of the medical practices during the Civil War. Dicks has been "performing surgery" for over 20 years.

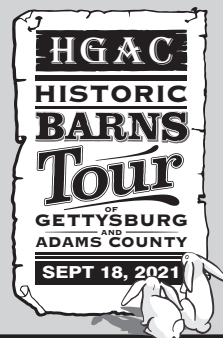
